

#### **OTAGO UNIVERSITY SCIENCES ACADEMY 2020**

The Otago University Advanced School Sciences Academy is an exciting programme aimed at Year 13 students with a passion for science and the potential to excel in their final year in NCEA.

**Caroline Kyle** and **Te Rena Drysdale** have both been offered a place in the Science Academy (OUASSA) 2020. In addition, Te Rena was also awarded one of only two scholarships offered to Science Academy students by the Dodd-Walls Centre for Photonic and Quantum Technologies.

Both girls had to answer questions telling the University about themselves and why they wanted to join the academy, and also write an essay about their thoughts on Science in the 21st Century.

Caroline and Te Rena will attend two residential science camps on the University of Otago, Dunedin, campus, a summer science camp in January and a winter science camp in July.

Following the July camp they will be supported by online tutors, who will present 10 online tutorials targeted at NCEA/scholarship physics, chemistry, and biology in the run up to the external examinations at the end of the year.

Both girls are very excited about this wonderful opportunity and we are very excited for them! We are looking forward to hearing about their first camp when they come back to school in Term 1, 2020.


#### **SPLASH PLANET**




