INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL TESTING

Over the last week all year 9 and 10 students have been participating in PAT testing for Maths, English and Science. This testing is to give students an indication of strengths and weaknesses in each subject area and will be a guide for teaching and learning programmes for the year. We commend all students who have given these assessments 100% effort and exhibited appropriate exam behaviour.

MATES AND DATES

We have been given the opportunity to be involved in a program for our Year 9 and 10 students that is run by Birthright called "Mates and Dates". An overview of what this is:

- Help prevent sexual and dating violence by teaching students healthy relationship skills and behaviours
- Five week healthy relationships programme across Years 9-10
- Taught by trained facilitators and class teachers will be present
- Running in secondary schools around the country.

This is an opportunity for our students to explore appropriate boundaries and strategies to manage situations that are sensitive. There is an opportunity to opt out of this program, please contact your child's Dean if you do not want them to be part of these sessions. The sessions will cover:

- healthy relationships
- skills and consent
- identity, gender and sexuality
- when things go wrong
- keeping safe together.

EIT TRADES ACADEMY

The EIT Trades Academy has started up again for the year - we have 18 students enrolled in a range of

courses at EIT in Gisborne - Hospitality, Agriculture, Trade skills, Building, Hair and Beauty, Computing,

Automotive. These courses continue for the full year. Students are transported to Gisborne each Friday to get a taste of Tertiary study. Trades Academy is coordinated at our school by Karen Hayward.

Another popular course that we are repeating this year is Agriculture for Year 11 students - we have two groups enrolled - 20 students

altogether, a good mix of male and female students - and they go out onto farms each Thursday and Friday. The students are supervised, taught and assessed by qualified EIT tutors, Tahi and Warren. They are hosted on Ohuia Station by Mike Lloyd, and on Swanns Farm by Paul and Sonya Swann. We are very grateful to have these farmers provide great learning opportunities to our students this year and in the past. Students will experience fencing, shearing, crutching, livestock care, and learn how to stay healthy and safe in the work environment. The courses provide



3 terms of learning with 22 credits attached, and are STAR funded. According to the bunch of students that have started this week they are going to really enjoy themselves this year. Further details about this course can be gained by contacting Karen Hayward.

POLICE PROGRAMME

Don't be alarmed if you see Police cars here at school. The secondary school Police Programme has started at Wairoa College this year as a new initiative between us and the NZ Police. The aim of the programme is to provide students with knowledge, skills, attitudes required to join the NZ Police Force. They will spend several days a week with members of our local police, they will do physical fitness and will also spend time doing bookwork to meet their NCEA requirements - the course is Level 3 and offers 30

credits.



We currently have eight Year 13 students enrolled in this course which is facilitated by Karen Hayward, Shelley Murphy, Noui Whaanga, and Nicki Davies (Wairoa Police) and the Services Academy.

Students will develop a better understanding of the role of a police officer, they will learn about core values, leadership, interview skills, the NZ Court system, career possibilities within the Police, law and legislation. It is great to have our local officers on board with this. There is no cost to schools to do this course.

Students will more clearly understand the recruitment process when applying to join the Police Force.

ROAD SAFETY PROGRAMME

Tairawhiti REAP and Wairoa College have been working with GOT Drive regional coordinator Cherie to make this happen. The simulator (photo attached) will be situated at Wairoa College on the 24,25 & 26 Feb (Mon-Wed) and 27 & 28 in the community - WCC and hopefully Marine Pde (tbc). The students and community members are able to sit in the simulator - select an appropriate driving experience prog - based on their level of driving and be taken through roading scenarios. We hope to put through between 8 - 14 ppl per day realistically as the program times vary from 10 - 15 mins long.

For those who have never driven but coming up to sit their learners, there is a program that doesn't

For community - distractions. The driver will receive txt messages, respond and will get a print out of the difference made to their control when distracted, apparently, this is a real eye-opener for avid texters!!

This initiative requires a collaboration of organisations. We are looking for staff who can offer to do sections of the week-long schedule. For this to be successful we require individuals who can supervise between - College, REAP, Police, KE and SHB. Cherie will do a brief training session for us all on Monday, 24 February at the College from 9.30 - 10.30 and apparently the technology is easy to pick up. NZTA will be here on Friday, 28 February which could be a good time to discuss Wairoa's needs in terms of Road safety while he is here!



CACTUS 28 started on Monday 10th February and will run for the next 7 weeks of this term ending with the gruelling longest day on Saturday 4th April. A total of 27 students have signed up as the 28th intake and will partake in a number of physical activities every morning on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
