

Wairoa College Services Academy Basic Leaders Course

Valerie Karaka, Brooke Pullar, Shyanne Smith and myself Chelsea Nicholas from our Services Academy.

We displayed leadership skills during our 2-week Induction course at Waiouru Military Camp we had been nominated to attend a five day Basic Leadership course held at El Rancho, Waikanae, Kapiti conducted by the Youth Life Skills company of the New Zealand Defence Force over the period 30 Apr-04 May 18

The Aim of the Basic Leadership course is to provide the students with basic understanding from which to develop character and competence to effectively, undertake basic leadership roles within their Academy, School and community.

Every day at the camp was an opportunity for us to improve our leadership skills and to build confidence in ourselves.

As soon as we arrived at the camp, after our bag inspections we assembled into the lecture hall, we were then being taught the different styles of leadership that there is, and examples of how leadership is used in a team.

After this lesson, we were, put into syndicates (7 people per syndicate). Each syndicate went with their syndicate commanders to separate locations to perform a group task while ours stayed in the lecture hall. We were given the task to re-arrange the tables in chairs with specific limitations, afterwards we settled with a debrief. This gave our syndicate commanders a chance to see how we work in a group and a chance for ourselves to see what we need to improve on if we are to be a team leader.

On Wednesday and Thursday our syndicates spent the day performing assessment tasks in our group as well as taking turns being the leader. We had our own task of which we were given to run, this gave each of us the opportunity to express our leadership potential. Our tasks on Wednesday were all practice tasks whereas the completely different tasks on Thursday were being evaluated by our syndicate commanders.

To pass, each of us needed to show leadership skills such as; attention to details, self-confidence and effective communication.

My syndicate performed our given tasks efficiently and in a manner that every syndicate member has a job to do.

I believe the Basic Leaders camp at El Rancho helped me improve my leadership skills and allowed me to enhance my confidence in public speaking.

The Level 2 and 3 Senior PE class have been coaching two Year 8 classes Ki-O-Rahi throughout Terms 1 and 2 for their PE NCEA assessment. The senior students were lucky enough to have Esta Wainohu (Kaimahi Hakinakina ki Te Wairoa) teach them the game of Ki-O-Rahi before they were put to the challenge of coaching. There are a lot of skills involved with Ki-O-Rahi including running, sidestepping, one handed and two handed accurate passing and catching, flag/tag ripping skills, jump shots and accurate shooting/throwing and blocking.



The Year 8 students were taught the importance of bringing their PE gear to every lesson, participating in physical activity, learning to communicate and cooperate with others along with learning about Ki-O-Rahi.



Jorian Tangaere, who is the Community Sport Development Officer at Sport Hawke's Bay in Taradale, travelled to Wairoa to teach the senior students some coaching activities so they could incorporate them into their lessons. The seniors enjoyed listening to Jorian and taking part in the activities he had planned for them.

The senior students found it quite challenging taking on the role of a coach and have said that they now appreciate people even more who step into the role of a coach/ teacher.

The Peter Shaw Services to Hockey cup is given every year in recognition for great services to Hockey.


