Te Ngaio

This waka moana carries the mauri (life force) of the Wairoa District Schools Kapahaka Festival. The waka was commissioned to remind us that the Kapahaka festival has mauri and is important to the people of Wairoa.

Te Ngaio means expert, thorough. The name Te Ngaio was chosen to remind us that we should uphold the kapahaka festival with expertise and thoroughness, not only in the way our tamariki perform with pride, but in the way the festivals are managed.

This MAURI waka is to be passed from host school to host school at the closing ceremony of every festival to ensure that the kapahaka is not left unattended.

An ocean canoe was chosen because it reminds us of the courage and perseverance that our ancestors displayed to arrive at Aotearoa. It will give strength to the host school and Te Ngaio's guardians, to meet the challenge of hosting the festival. The ocean waka of our ancestors carried precious cargo; the cargo of this waka is the MAURI of the Kapahaka festival.

This waka was commissioned in 2007 by Ngā Kaitiaki o Te Ngaio, who are the Māori Teachers and Kapahaka tutors of the Wairoa District Schools. Their role is to uphold the MAURI and support the kapahaka festivals by providing counsel and support to the hosting school.
